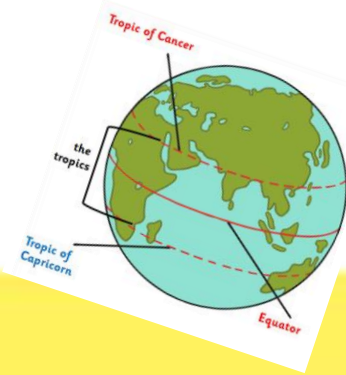

- the equator, Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn are invisible lines that run around the earth (the equator is at 0° and the tropics are 23.5° north and south of the equator)
- the Arctic circle is 66.5° north of the equator and the Antarctic circle is 66.5° south of the equator
- lines of longitude and latitude help create a 4-digit grid reference to help us find places
- the earth is split up into 24 different time zones
- maps are drawn to 'scale' to show a true representation of the size of things
- LS Lowry was an artist born in Manchester in 1887, famous for painting industrial scenes with matchstick figures
- 'Brian and Michael' wrote a number one hit about LS Lowry in 1978

Key Vocabulary

equator – an imaginary line drawn around the centre of the earth at an equal distance away from both the north and south pole

latitude - the distance of a place north or south of the equator

longitude – the distance of a place east or west of the Greenwich meridian

grid reference – a map reference using a series of numbers and/or letters to pinpoint location

scale – a way to draw something smaller than it really is, but keeping it in proportion to the real size

industrial – an area where raw materials are processed and goods are manufactured in factories
