Reception

Communication and Language

They answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events. They use past, present and future forms accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future.

They develop their own narratives and explanations by connecting ideas or events.

Reading

Recognises familiar words in their reading books.

Recognises rhyme in spoken words.

To segment and blend CVC words.

Writing

Write own name.

Write labels & captions Begin to form simple sentences.

Correct letter formation.

Maths

Place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. Using quantities and objects, they subtract two single-digit numbers and count back to find the answer. E.g. 9-3=

Solve problems, including doubling

Physical

Children show good control and coordination in large and small movements.

Children know the importance for good health of physical exercise, and a healthy diet. Can talk about ways to keep healthy and safe.

They manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs successfully, including dressing and going to the toilet independently. **Can dress self, including coat and shoes and fastening.**
