Annie Kenney grew up in Springhead, Oldham. She was a Suffragette.

Suffragettes were women who fought for the equal right to vote.

A cotton mill was a building full of machines which turned cotton into different fabrics. Annie Kenney started working in a cotton mill when she was 10.

Rosa Parks grew up in Alabama, USA.

Rosa Parks refused to give up her bus seat for a white passenger.

Rosa Parks fought for equality amongst different races.
