Annie Kenney grew up in Springhead, Oldham. She was a Suffragette.

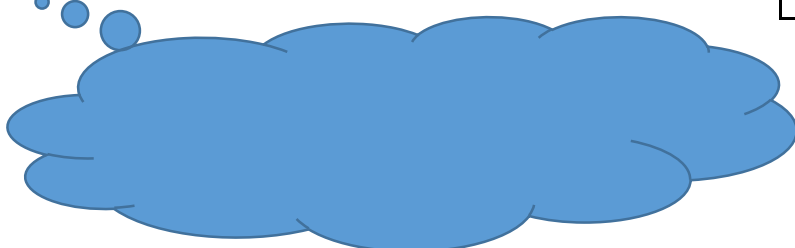
Suffragettes were women who fought for the equal right to vote.
